| B1 What is the Decision? | To offer funding for the development of Community Kitchens in the borough, with the intention of tackling poverty and isolation. |

B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?

- To find a community led solution for nutrition and food poverty, as part of the wider piece of work to support resident with the Cost of Living.
- Applicants to the scheme need to set out how they meet the following conditions utilising the form at Appendix 1:
 - o Based in East Staffordshire
 - Be a non-profit, community or charitable organisation which provides food for the community
 - Describe mobilisation and outcomes, as well as detail how this links, complements or builds on existing community work.
 - Describe how food safety and the health and safety of participants will be managed.
 - Describe how the funding will be used.
- A member led panel will consider applications on a regular basis with professional food safety input, and successful applications will be chosen up to the limit of the funding envelope.
- This is a pilot initiative, and for that reason has deliberately been kept 'open' in terms of how much funding each individual organisation will receive and the potential outcomes. It is anticipated that this fund could support up to 5 community kitchens running a limited number of sessions, but this will ultimately be determined by the applications received
- Successful applicants need to sign the condition of grant aid form at Appendix 2, and will receive an initial payment of 50%, with the remainder to follow at the half way point of the project.
- Community Kitchens to email the receipts for items they have purchased with this fund and a record of the amount they have spent for monitoring purposes.
