B1 What is the Decision?	To continue to support the Live & Local Community Touring Scheme Programme for three years 2024-27 with an ongoing annual grant of £4,480. This amount includes approximately an 8.5% uplift.
B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?	East Staffordshire Borough Council has had a Service Level Agreement with Live & Local for over 20 years of £4,000 per annum towards their Community Touring Scheme Programme. This has been granted on a Service Level Agreement basis during this time. However from 2024 Live & Local are seeking approximately an 8.5% uplift in the grant agreement in order to maintain the level of outputs.
	The SLA will see L&L commit to programme and support a minimum of 42 outputs across the period 01-Jun-24 to 31-May-27 to within the constraints of the promoter bids ensuring geographical spread of work across the East Staffs Borough Council's area.
B2 Alternative options considered and rejected?	The alternative option would be for East Staffordshire Borough Council to maintain the current funding agreement of £4,000, but reduce the number of agreed outputs per calendar year. This could have a community impact on cultural engagement across East Staffordshire.
B3 What are the contributions to Corporate Priorities?	Creating a prosperous East Staffordshire

	Signing the agreement will commit East Staffordshire Borough Council to pay Live & Local £4,480 for 3 years, 2024-27 to support the Community Touring Scheme Programme. A break clause is detailed in the contract.
	This expenditure will be met from the current Brewhouse Arts budget £4,500 allocated in the base budget CF86-R4252.
