B1 What is the Decision?	To procure an Outdoor Classroom to support community horticultural activity in Uttoxeter. The classroom will be situated in the 'Go Garden' at Uttoxeter Leisure Centre. The space will be used to enhance volunteering opportunities, support social prescribing and provide a warm and dry shelter.
	In order to facilitate this project the purchase of an Outdoor classroom is required. Three quotes have been sought and the selected provider is UK Gardens (£13,595.45 if purchased before the end of February 2023). This was the lowest value quote.
	One quote (£2,975.00) has been sought and accepted to lay the concrete base for the shed. The selected provider is: DSK Engineering.
B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?	The Council will be offering support to residents who are experiencing hardship with the cost of living. Providing this facility will allow community support to take place through community volunteering as well as providing an opportunity for social prescribing and supporting residents with mental health issues during this crisis (and beyond).
