	This is a project to be part-funded by the UK Shared Prosperity Fund's Ward Enhancement Project being delivered by Making Trails.
	Following the success of the Burton Swans and The Big Burton Carousel (TBBC) art trails, Burton Barrel Roll will be Burton's first 3D sculpture trail; it will feature 12 giant beer barrels, an iconic symbol of Burton. These sculptures will be sited at points of historical and cultural importance across Burton town centre, and each will be painted by a local artist, showcasing more about the history of the town.
	It will attract tourists to the town. The previous trail saw over 20,000 visitors; we were able to track these figures through the opening event, trail app, map downloads and printed-map giveaways.
