ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the mandatory conditions set in section 19 Licensing Act 2003 reproduced below :-

Mandatory conditions - supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence the licence-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Conditions) Order 2014

- (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted" price is the price found by applying the formula $P=D+(D \times V)$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

- (3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Conditions)(Amendment) Order 2014

- 1 (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can be reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2 The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonable available.
- 3 (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4 The responsible person must ensure that-
 - (a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) Beer or cider: ½ pint;

- (ii) Gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- (iii) Still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) These measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) Where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH OPERATING THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

The prevention of crime and disorder

- CCTV must be installed and operating correctly to manufacturers instructions internally and externally and must cover all public areas where licensable activity takes place whilst the premises is open to the public. This must include all areas that smokers are allowed to congregate. The picture must be clear enough to identify people's facial features.
- The time and date must be set to the correct time relating to BST/GMT
- A competent trained person in the use of and operation of the CCTV must be in attendance at the premises at all times that licensable activities take place and be able to fully operate the CCTV system to be able to download at the time of the visit in a recognised format any information requested by the Police or Responsible Authority.
- All CCTV images must be retained for a period of not less than 31 days and any evidential incidents must be downloaded and stored in a secure system until such time as collected by an appropriate authority. Clear signage must be displayed at all entrance and exits indicating that CCTV is in operation.
- An incident register of all occurrences and ejections from the premises must be maintained at the premises and any details of any incidents of crime or disorder or misuse of drugs offences must be recorded. The register must be produced and made available at the time of the visit for inspection upon request by any responsible authority.
- All persons involved in the sale of alcohol who are not the holder of a Personal Licence to sell alcohol must receive initial and regular 3 monthly refresher training by the Designated Premises Supervisor or training provider with regards to the law in relation to the sale of alcohol. Such training must be recorded and up to date training records of all such persons must be maintained at the premises and produced and made available for inspection at the time of the visit by a responsible authority. There must be twelve months records retained.
- Both initial and subsequent refresher training in relation to the sale of age restricted products must contain a written test to be undertaken by the staff member and this record must be signed and dated by both the member of staff and the designated premises supervisor.
- At any time when the DPS is not physically present on the premises there must be present a nominated person who has been authorised by the DPS to cover their functions under the licensing act. Any such person should have seen read and be fully aware of the conditions of the premises licence and take all steps to ensure that such conditions are adhered to whilst they have responsibility for the venue. The record must be produced and made available at the time of the visit for inspection upon request by any responsible authority.

Public Safety

- No persons will be permitted to take any opened vessels containing any alcoholic/non alcoholic drinks from the boundaries of the premises.
- All glasses and bottles must be removed from the public areas as soon as reasonably practicable after they are finished with or are empty.

The prevention of public nuisance

- A noise management plan to be agreed with Environmental Health and implemented at the premises. The plan must be produced and made available for inspection upon request by a responsible authority.
- A notice advising customers to leave the premises quietly and respect the needs of residents must be displayed at each of the exits of the premises.

- The premises must operate a Challenge 25 policy and all staff must receive training in relation to the scheme. The only acceptable forms of identification being a passport or photo card driving licence bearing a holographic mark or other form of identification bearing the customers photograph, date of birth and the proof or age standard scheme (or similarly accredited scheme) hologram. Challenge 25 signage must be displayed at the entrance to the premises and at the cash till payment areas.
- A refusals register with details of all refusals must be maintained at the premises. The register must contain details of the staff member refusing the sale and must be checked on a monthly basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor and signed and dated by the Designated Premises Supervisor. The refusals register whether paper or electronic must be produced and made available for inspection at the time of the visit by any Responsible Authority.
- At each till there must be placed a date of birth check card which must be kept updated at all times with the current date at which a person must be born to be aged 18 or over.

ANNEX 3 - CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY**The prevention of public nuisance**

- Windows and doors at the premise shall be kept closed after 23:00 hours when regulated entertainment is taking place except for access, egress and in cases of emergency.
- No open vessels containing any alcohol or other drinks will be allowed to be taken outside the premise after 23:00 hours. Consumption prior to this time will only be in the designated outside drinking areas.

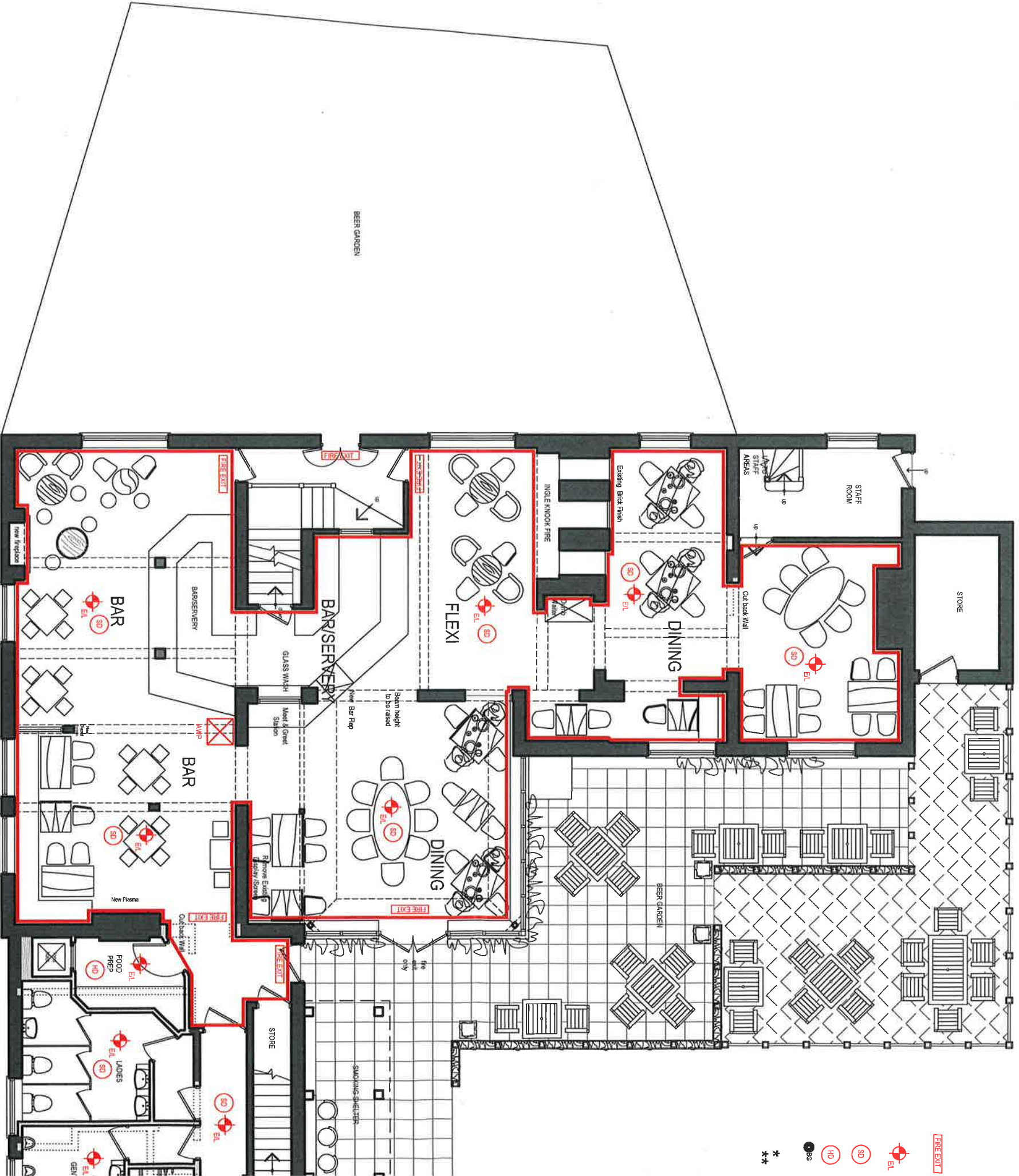

5. Details of "Break Glass" alarm point to rear of bar and in food preparation areas only, to avoid false alarms. Linked to alarm system as above and to BS 5839 Pt 1

6. Details of "Fire Door" self-closing fire door. To be provided to meet the requirements of BS 5499 Pt 1, Part 4, and to be Health and Safety Signs and Symbols Page 1996

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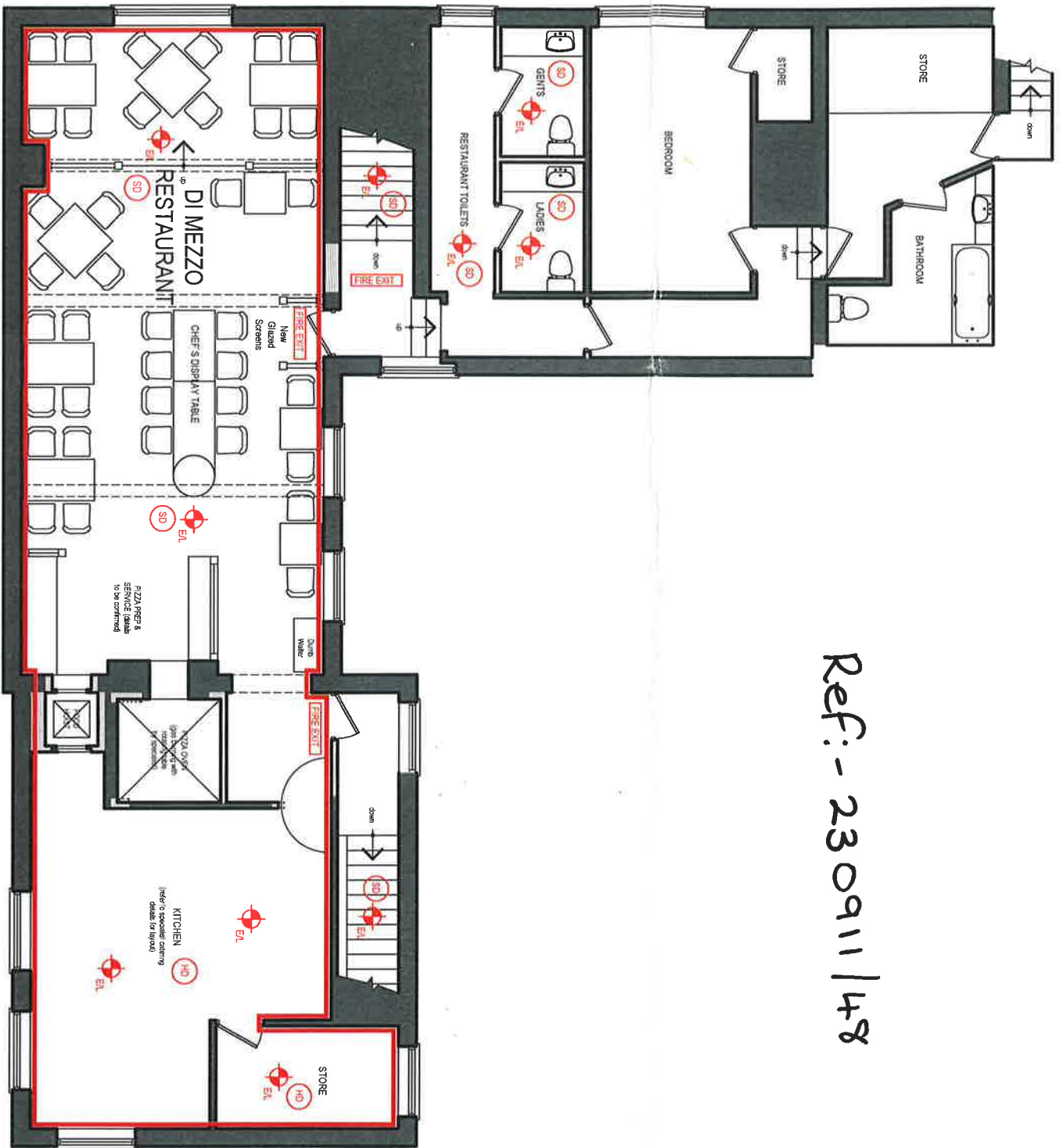
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PROPOSED FIRST FLOOR PLAN
