Rolleston on Dove Neighbourhood Development Plan

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Introduction

This Consultation Statement summarises the community engagement programme and the Regulation 14 consultations that were undertaken for the Rolleston on Dove Neighbourhood Development Plan 2017 to 2033. It shows how the requirements of Regulations 14 and 15 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 have been satisfied.

Summary of Community & Stakeholder Engagement

Rolleston on Dove Parish Council developed a programme of community and stakeholder engagement and this has been used to guide the process of producing the Neighbourhood Development Plan. It demonstrates that the Parish Council recognises that the Neighbourhood Development Plan must reflect the needs of the community and the local area. The Rolleston on Dove Parish Council has sought to communicate with residents in a timely and effective manner and to inform and actively engage with them throughout the process of producing the Neighbourhood Development Plan.

The community engagement carried out on behalf of the Parish Council in producing the draft Neighbourhood Development Plan is summarised in Figure 1, the Timetable of Community Engagement. To achieve the varied community engagement, the Parish Council has used a wide range of communication methods including special open meetings, workshops, the village notice boards, public canvassing, social media such as the Facebook page and the parish website. Specially printed leaflets, questionnaires and a housing needs survey were circulated to all households in the parish at the relevant key stages. Updates were also included in the local newsletter, the Rollestonian, circulated to every household within the parish.

October 2018	Regulation 14 consultation period. A leaflet was distributed by volunteers to every household within RoD. Hard copies of the draft plan were available to view in the Rolleston Club, Jinnie Inn pub, The Old Grammar School and St Mary's Church., Village residents attended a drop-in session for review of hard copy of draft plan and to discuss the plan. It was also made available on Facebook and the Village website as well as being promoted on the Nextdoor mobile phone app. Comments received were reviewed and the NDP was updated where necessary.	

The Neighbourhood Development Plan itself has been led by the Rolleston on Dove Neighbourhood Development Plan Steering Group, made up of Parish councillors and volunteers from the local community. In producing this draft Neighbourhood Development Plan, the Steering Group has been supported by Navigus consultants and Neighbourhood Development Planning specialists, Urban Vision Enterprise CIC.

The Neighbourhood Development Plan has undertaken, or will be undertaking, the following statutory consultation as part of the process:

- Publicity of the neighbourhood area (already done by Local Planning Authority (LPA))
- Pre-submission consultation (done by Parish Council)
- Publicity following submission (to be done by LPA)

Pre Submission Consultation (Regulation 14)

During the period of creating the Rolleston on Dove Neighbourhood Development Plan, the Pre Submission Consultation (Regulation 14) has been carried out twice in 2013 and 2018. At the formation of the second steering group in May 2017, it was agreed that although most of the consultation would need to be repeated, the revised Neighbourhood Development Plan would be based largely on the plan that had already been submitted. This meant that all of the comments and feedback already received were incorporated into the new submission, along with those received through the repeated Regulation 14 process.

In both instances, the residents of Rolleston on Dove were given every opportunity to see the draft Neighbourhood Development Plan. This was achieved in several ways:

- Article in local newsletter, the Rollestonian
- A housing needs survey to every household (receiving a 39% response rate)
- Specially printed leaflets hand delivered to every household within the parish (Appendix 1)
- Leaflet posted up in Parish Council noticeboards
- Hard copies of the draft NDP in the Jinnie Pub, Rolleston Club, The Grammar School, St Mary's Church
- Featured on Parish Council website, Facebook page and Nextdoor mobile phone application
- Open days
- Public canvassing over 2 weekends

Comments could be made via the website or directly by email to the parish clerk. Hard copies of the comment form were available at each open day, where Parish Councillors and members of the steering group were available to answer questions.

Statutory Consultees

A planning officer from East Staffordshire Borough Council gave the steering group a full list of statutory consultees and these were contacted individually by email via the parish clerk. As well as the plan being attached, each consultee was directed to the website where the draft Neighbourhood Development Plan could also be viewed.

Local businesses and organisations were also part of the process as they were also hand delivered leaflets.

At all times during the consultation process, every effort has been made to ensure everyone contacted has been able to access the draft Neighbourhood Development Plan and give their comments.

Details of the list of statutory consultees can be seen in the Appendix 2.

Consultation Comments Made and Reviewed

Comments were logged and analysed by the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group. At more than one meeting, decisions were made on whether any action needed to be taken to amend the plan where necessary.
