1. Purpose of the Report

1.1. For the Council to note and approve changes to the Council's Constitution.

2. Background

- 2.1. The Council is required to review its constitution regularly.
- 2.2. At the meeting on the 13th December 2021, Council agreed recommendations to make changes to several committees.
- 2.3. This report brings forward the latest proposals for changes.
- 2.4. The December Council also agreed that the Freedom of the Borough and Alderman procedures be clarified as part of the next update to the Constitution. As previously documented elsewhere, the Council is currently undertaking a full review of the Constitution. This is scheduled to completed during quarter one of 2022/23. In order to facilitate this, the current procedure for appointing honorary positions is included at Appendix 10.

3. Contribution to Corporate Priorities

3.1. This report does not directly contribute to Corporate Priorities but the Council's Constitution is an important document in enabling the Council to implement the Corporate Plan.

4. Proposed Changes to the Constitution

- 4.1. At the meeting on the 13th December, Council agreed the following changes:
 - 4.1.1. That the membership of the Planning Committee be reduced from 15 to 11 Members:
 - 4.1.2. That the membership of the Licensing Committee be reduced from 15 to 11 Members;
 - 4.1.3. That the Licensing Committee meeting timings be moved to the evening;
 - 4.1.4. That a standalone Audit Committee be created, consisting of 8 Members and 2 independent Members;
 - 4.1.5. That the number of Scrutiny Committees be increased to 3;
 - 4.1.6. That the membership of scrutiny committees be reduced from 16 to 8 Members;
 - 4.1.7. That the Senior Officer Employment Committee be renamed as the Chief Officer Standards Committee; and
 - 4.1.8. That an additional meeting of the Council be added to the Council calendar in September from the 2022 municipal year onwards.
 - 4.1.9. That the changes above be implemented with effect from the new municipal year i.e. 13 May 2022
 - 4.1.10 That a further report be brought to the next meeting of Council with the relevant changes to the Constitution, including setting out detailed Terms of Reference for the new Scrutiny and Audit Committees.
 - 4.2. As such, the relevant 'Terms of Reference' for the above committees have been amended. In addition, a summary of responsibilities for each of the Scrutiny Committees has been inserted into the corresponding terms of reference.

5. <u>Financial Considerations</u>
