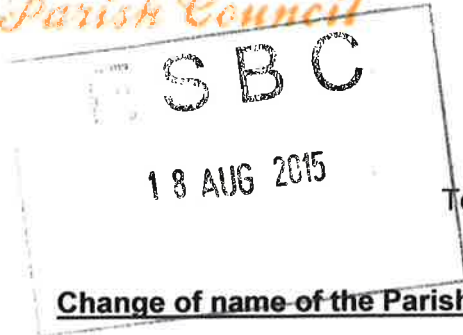

Dear Andy,

At its meeting of 28<sup>th</sup> July 2015, Tatenhill Parish Council resolved to request East Staffordshire Borough Council to authorise the change of name of the Parish to "Tatenhill and Rangemore Parish" under s75 of Local Government Act 1972. (Resolution 350).

The Parish Council has been established since the 4<sup>th</sup> of December 1894 when a Parish meeting was held under the Local Government Act 1894 in the Tatenhill Schoolroom. Seven nominees were declared elected as councillors by the Chairman of the meeting. The first Parish Council meeting was held on 19<sup>th</sup> December 1894.

Since this time there have been boundary changes and Rangemore has grown in to a more significant village with the conversion of Rangemore Hall and Mews and development at Wilmore Lane. The Council consider the new name would not only be a more inclusive name but would be a clearer description of what area our parish covers.

As a result it was decided to consult the public through the Newsletter, by raising it at the Annual Parish Meeting and by asking the Tatenhill Parish Community Group for their opinion.

The results of the consultation were:

6 responses from the Newsletter consultation-All supported the name change  
Tatenhill Parish Community Group supported the name change.

9 parishioners attended the Annual Parish meeting. All but one supported the name change. The 1 objection was on cost grounds.

There are 315 dwellings within the Parish, some 126 in Tatenhill, 118 in Rangemore (including the 38 dwellings in Rangemore Hall and Mews), 33 on Tatenhill Common and 38 in other rural areas. It is a small parish in terms of people but consists of a considerable area of land, measuring 1504.29 hectares. The population is 725 and in January 2011 there 593 registered electors.
